

SIGNS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Individual:

- is not in control of their ID/passport
- lacks knowledge of whereabouts
- is restricted/controlled in communicating with others
- is being watched or followed
- mentions having a pimp or making a quota
- shows signs of bruising
- has a brand/tattoo of the trafficker's name

WHAT TO REPORT

- Describe the vehicles. What cars or trucks were involved? Identify the make, model, color, license plate, etc.
- Describe the people involved. Their height, weight, complexion, hair color, eye color, age, tattoos or piercings, etc.
- Give specific dates and times when you witnessed the suspected activity.
- Provide specific addresses and locations where you witnessed this activity.
